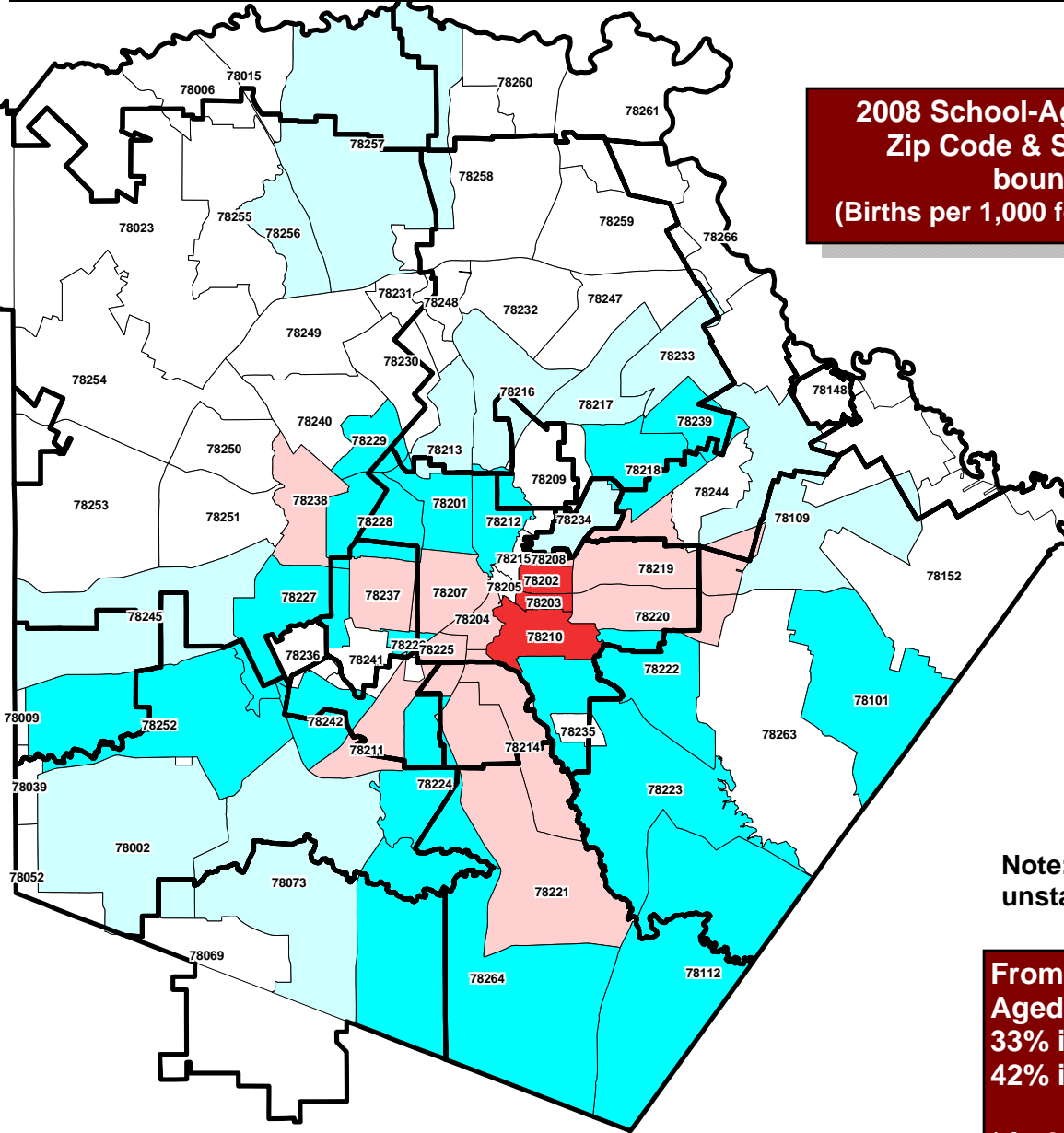

2008 School-Age birth rates by Zip Code & School District boundaries (Births per 1,000 females ages 15-17)



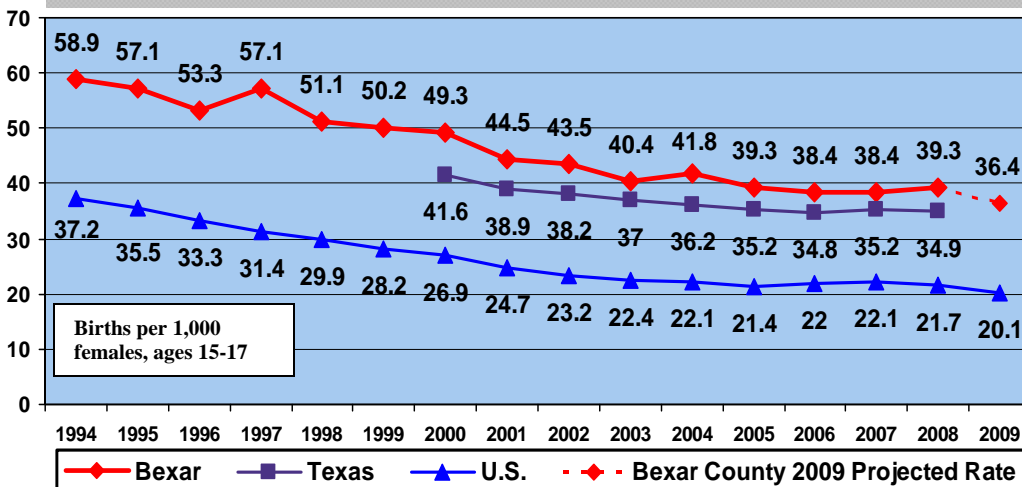
- Over 86.8 per 1,000 (Over 4 times the National Rate)
- 65.2 to 86.8 per 1,000 (3 to 4 times the National Rate)
- 43.5 to 65.1 per 1,000 (2 to 3 times the National Rate)
- 21.8 to 43.4 per 1,000 (1 to 2 times the National Rate)
- 21.7 or less per 1,000 (At or below the National Rate)

Note: Birth rates may be unstable in small areas

From 1994 to 2008 School-Aged birth rate dropped 33% in Bexar County and 42% in the United States.

*** In 2008, the Bexar County school-age birth rate was 81% higher than the National Rate.**

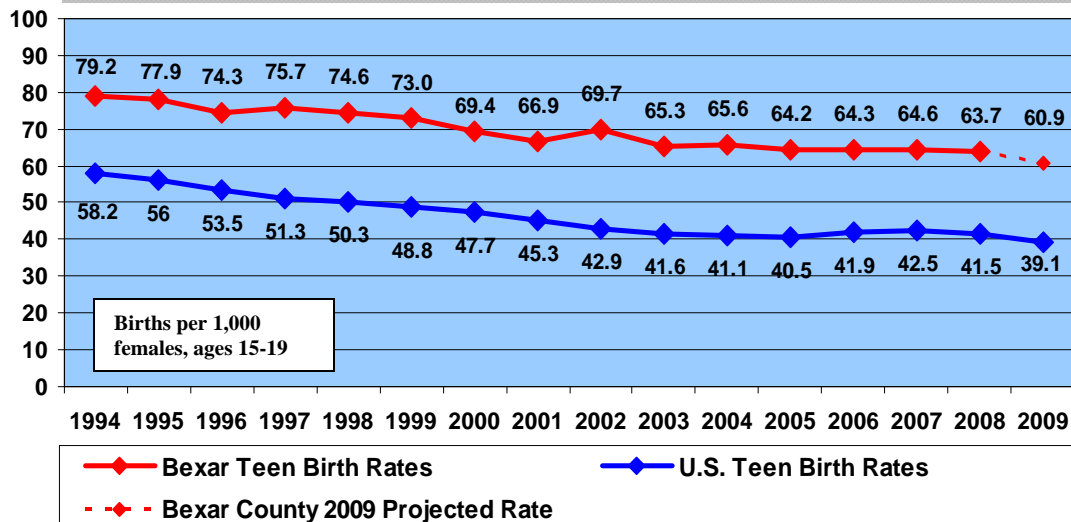
School-Age Birth Rates (females ages 15-17) 1994 - 2008



Birth Rates (females ages 15-19) 1994 - 2008

The 2008 birth rate for Bexar County females (ages 15-19) declined **20%** since 1994

BUT...
-The Bexar County birth rate was **53%** higher than the National Rate

Other 2008 Facts:

- 24% of all Bexar County Births to females ages 12-19 were subsequent births
- 59% of all fathers of babies born to females under 18 were themselves 18 years of age and older
- Cases of Chlamydia increased to 3,027 for youth ages 10-19 from 2,834 in 2007
- Cases of Syphilis (all stages) for youth ages 10-19, increased to 45 from 21 cases in 2007
- Cases of HIV (ages 10-19) increased to 13 from 11 cases in 2007
